So many students were acknowledged and awarded scholarships. We are so proud of the accomplishments of the senior class. This past weekend, our 2nd annual Relay for Life American Cancer Fundraiser took place. It was coordinated by SHS students, WB faculty and staff as well as countless volunteers. The event was a great success and Dr. Farrelly posted pictures Saturday night. Yesterday, 6/11/18, the first "Elementary Senior Walk" took place. Elementary school staff and faculty enjoyed reconnecting with their former students as the seniors walked, wearing their graduation caps and gowns, through the elementary schools. Needless to say, the embrace was emotional at times. Stay tuned for pictures and videos! This morning, Dr. Farrelly hosted the first "Blue and Gold Top 25 Breakfast". The top 25 students were asked to invite a "special someone" who has had an impact on their educational career. A *Newsday* reporter was at Tooker Avenue this morning to interview our Kindergarten students. The students were asked to give advice to the incoming Kindergarteners.

The project is a partnership with the PTA. Dr. Farrelly introduced Mr. Payne and Mrs. Taplin. Mr. Payne gave full credit for the presentation to Mrs. Taplin. Mrs. Taplin provided mats and introduced Ms. Allison Giogianni, JFK Math Specialist. Mrs. Giogianni further explained the program use in the classroom and introduced the following JFK students who participated in hands-on demonstrations: Darren Barje, 4th Grade; Sophia Corrigan, 2nd Grade; and James Barje and Fiona Corrigan, 1st Grade. The demonstrations were very entertaining and informative. Mrs. Taplin said a "Family Fun Night" is scheduled for some time in October 2018.

With the assistance of SA's head custodian, Mr. Mike LoGuidice, who will volunteer his own time, Mr. Chip DeGennaro, and his landscaping company, will work on a rock/paving stone garden. The SA PTA, and one particular member, has offered to donate a tremendous amount of time and resources to enable the rock garden to become a beautiful place.

Friendship benches may be distinctively different from other seating in the school and may be specially designed by an artist or with the help of the children themselves. They can be rainbow colored and these benches are situated in open and well-traveled areas of the school so that any child using the bench will be noticed quickly.

When a child feels the need for a friend to talk to, he or she can show this by using the friendship bench. Other children and staff will recognize this as a sign that some help, support or comfort is needed and will come to talk with the child.

The friendship bench is a means by which a child can seek support without the need to rationalize their feelings or to seek-out a particular member of staff or special friend. Because the bench is in the day-to-day environment of the school it can be used at any time and for any reason—from seemingly trivial matters to more serious concerns—and encourages children to ask for help when they are troubled.

Discussion: A. Capital Project Update: SHS Crosswalk-Dr. Yiendhy Farrelly, Superintendent of Schools; Mrs. Michele Psarakis, CPA, Assistant Superintendent for Finance & Operations

On June 5th, Dr. Farrelly along with Mrs. Psarakis, Mr. Ray Graziano and Board President Lucy Campasano met with BBS Architects, School Construction Consultants and Web Construction to discuss the SHS crosswalk and the puddling concern. Discussion was held and the group did a walk through of the site. During the recent rainy days, Mr. Graziano

had taken a series of pictures (at intervals from 9AM to dismissal time) of the area. In all cases, after heavy rainfall and the passing of several hours, the puddling was gone. In certain other areas of the district, puddles did still exist. Web Construction did change the "crate cover" that currently existed at the SHS site. This change should take care of one puddle, but not the puddle farther away. The proposed solution would be to cut out the walkway area and redo it with a pitch to a center crate. However, once you cut through asphalt it is only a matter of time (1-2 years) before the seam needs to be resealed. Mr. Graziano and Dr. Farrelly agreed it is best to leave the area; however, this is the Board's decision. Board President Lucy Campasano has asked us to look into the cost to cut out and redo that area. Dr. Farrelly has asked Ms. Grundner from BBS to provide that information and it will be shared with the Board. A follow-up meeting is scheduled for June 13th.
