Dr. Farrelly welcomed the audience and thanked them for joining the Board and central administrators at Santapogue School for the Board meeting. The meeting was held at Santapogue to enable the Board and administrators to conduct an onsite capital project walk-through at Santapogue School.

Dr. Farrelly congratulated the SHS music department and students on the wonderful production of "Into the Woods". She shared that the students and faculty involved, in all aspects of the show, worked countless hours into the night over quite a long period of time to ensure the show's success.

Dr. Farrelly highlighted the success of several High School teams including the Varsity Girls Basketball team and their upcoming playoff game which will take place, at home, on Thursday at 5:45 PM, and the Varsity Cheerleading team placed 6th in the nation at the National competition held in Florida. The track team continues to have much success - on January 18th, the girls captured their 4th consecutive League Championship, becoming only the second team in 33 years to achieve such a feat for Section XI League III. On January 31st, the team placed 3rd at the County Championships, marking their 4th consecutive Top 3 County finish at the meet. Congratulations to the team. A special highlight - advancing to the State Championship for the second consecutive year in the 600 meter was Ja'Len DeFelippis.

Dr. Farrelly said two of our West Babylon Science Olympiad Teams competed again this past Saturday at the Tiger Lehigh Northwestern Invitational in Lehigh, PA. The event attracts the best schools from Pennsylvania, Delaware, New Jersey, New York, Connecticut and Massachusetts. West Babylon placed 11th overall and earned top 5 medals in four events. The following students received medals: Erin Thompson & Camilo Pnilla-Brown (3rd in Designer Genes); Gokul Ramesh & Ryan Marvin (4th in Gravity Vehicle); Olivia Golebiewski, Erin Thompson & Natalia Niebrzydowski (5th in Protein Modeling), and Megan Le & Ryan Marvin (5th in Wright Stuff). Congratulations to all!

Dr. Farrelly congratulated the 2020 SCOPE recipients: Mr. Ray Downey, Board of Education Trustee-School Board Service; Mrs. Michele Psarakis, CPA, Assistant Superintendent for Finance & Operations-Administrator Service; Mr. William Doran, K-12 Music Chairperson-Teacher Service Award; Mrs. Karen Lorito, Employee Benefits Senior Office Assistant-Support Staff Service, and Mrs. Trish Volz, Community Service Award. Dr. Farrelly thanked these individuals for all they do for our school district. The recipients will be honored at the Annual Dinner on March 23rd.

The week of February 10th to February 14th is PTAs Recognition Week. Dr. Farrelly said she would like to wish all the district PTAs a "huge" thank you for supporting our schools and students as they do!! She added that the day and evening programs are always so well-planned and well-organized. Our students and families enjoy all the activities so very much. Please know your efforts are greatly appreciated.

As an FYI, Dr. Farrelly shared that during the February break, boiler work will be happening at JFK and at the SHS; tree work will be ongoing at Tooker Avenue and at the JHS. Capital project electrical service upgrades at Forest Avenue and JFK will also be taking place.

Mrs. Margaret Barrett, PTA Council President, shared that the PTA Founders Day 2020 celebration will take place on Thursday, February 27th, at 7:00 PM in the Senior High School PAC. This celebration is a way to acknowledge the great work of teachers, staff and district volunteers. Mrs. Barrett invited all to attend. Dr. Farrellly shared that she had put the Founders Day Invitation Cards out for the public. Relating to budget presentations, Mrs. Barrett said she wished there was a presentation scheduled where residents were able to ask questions. Dr. Farrelly said each year an interactive Budget Hearing is held in May prior to the budget vote. All are welcome to attend. In addition, as has been done in the past, Mrs. Michele Psarakis, CPA, Assistant Superintendent for Finance & Operations, will be attending the upcoming PTA meetings and present her 2020-2021 budget PowerPoint presentation.

3. REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT AND/OR EDUCATIONAL PRESENTATION Presentation: A. NYS Assessments - ESSA Requirements Related to Participation: Mr. Scott Payne, Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum & Instruction

Dr. Farrelly introduced Mr. Payne and asked him to share the PowerPoint presentation/overview on state assessments updates. Changes to the NYS assessments over the last few years include the following: tests are now untimed (past 3 years); tests are developed with NYS teacher and parent input; tests have decreased from 3 to 2 days; and tests are no longer connected to APPR. Mr. Payne discussed the ESSA "Every Student Succeeds Act" and changes to NYS school ratings based on: 1. student academic achievement; 2. student growth; 3. academic progress; 4. English language proficiency; 5. chronic absenteeism; 6. graduation rates; and 7. college, career and civic readiness. Mr. Payne explained "TSI" Targeted Support Improvement-Measurement of NYS Sub-Groups in a School and "CSI" Comprehensive Support Improvement-Measurement of the Entire School (or TSI for several years) designations. Relating to parents, Mr. Scott reviewed the following topics "Parents-External Assessments are a Part of Education"; "Parents-Current Support System for K-8 Students"; "Parents-Student Performance Reports/Results"; and "Parents/Students-Positive Outcomes Associated with taking NYS Assessments". In closing, Mr. Payne shared "Possible Concerns" that parents and students might have including: test rigor/length and possible anxiety; possibly students with disabilities or special needs will not do well on exams; teachers will only teach to the test; test results will be used for promotion or placement decisions; and test results will be unfairly connected to a teacher's evaluation (APPR). Discussion was held regarding making parents aware of the NYS Assessments in a way which will assist those who may not be fully aware of these changes in deciding whether or not to let their child take a particular test or opt out. Discussion was also held as to the curriculum for a student who may not be taking a test on a particular day. Mr. Payne hosted a parent workshop titled "NYS Assessments: What Parents Need to Know" on January 29, 2020 relating to this topic. The February 11th BOE presentation will be posted to the district website.

Presentation: B. Presentation of 2020-2021 Budget Draft #1: Mrs. Michele Psarakis, CPA, Assistant Superintendent for Finance & Operations

Dr. Farrelly introduced Mrs. Psarakis and the 2020-2021 General Fund Budget Overview presentation. Mrs. Psarakis said the "budget calendar drives everything". She reviewed the budget timeline which spans the time period from November 2019 through the budget vote on May 19, 2020. The following topics were highlighted: Budget Development-Prior to Tax Levy Cap including state aid; Tax Levy Limit Calculation; Other Estimated Revenues; Revenue Projections based on Governor's Proposal; Actual and Projected Tax Levy before Allocating Bond Premium 2018-19 through 2024-2025; Projected Reserves/Fund Balance as of June 30, 2020; WBUFSD Reserve Balances; specific 2020-2021 New Budget Expenditures; 2020-2021 Recurring Budget Expenditures; Budget Appropriations by Object Code; 2020-2021 Tax Levy Chart and the "Next Steps" relating to the budget calendar timeline. At the March 10th Board meeting, discussion of Budget Draft #2 Development will continue; on March 20th, the Board will receive Budget Draft #2; on March 24th, Mrs. Psarakis will present Budget Draft #2 at the Board Meeting. Discussion was held and the Board agreed to file the tax levy with the Office of the State Comptroller using the projections allocating bond premium which results in a tax levy of approximately 3.9529 percent. The presentation will be posted to the website.
