The President opened the meeting at 7:03 pm and led those present in the Pledge to the Flag.

### SHS DECA PRESENTATION: 1st Place New York State Competition - "Entrepreneurship Growing Your Business"

Katherine Reilly-Johnson, Business Dept. Chairperson and Students Samantha Bifulco and Iryna Herych.

Board President Diane Thiel thanked everyone for attending this evening. Mr. Cacciola noted that this evening was the first student presentation the Board has seen in a while. He turned the meeting over to Ms. Reilly-Johnson, who introduced the students and allowed them to share their product and their presentation. Samantha and Iryna thanked the trustees and central administrators for their support in allowing them to attend the DECA competition. They both expressed enthusiasm for the DECA program and explained how they believe it prepares students for the future. The students also shared the product they developed, which is a protein bar called Nut Punch. They have a production factory in West Babylon and a website, www.terranut.com. In response to Mr. Cacciola's question, the students said that they are not looking for investors. The students again expressed their gratitude for the support of the Board of Education and administrators.

Trustee Scarlatos seconded by Trustee Wandasiewicz made a motion to go into Executive Session at 7:22 pm to discuss legal and personnel matters.

He congratulated Diane Klein, Dennis Kranz and Peter Scarlatos for their election to the Board of Education.

Mr. Cacciola said that last week was transportation appreciation week. He thanked the entire transportation staff for the wonderful job they do day in and day out. Mr. Cacciola commended Mr. Bianco and the department for receiving awards over the years for their 99% inspection passing rate. He also noted the wonderful job the drivers do as they are the first person in the district that many students see each day.

Mr. Cacciola congratulated last week's BACCA Award recipients: Best Ensemble — *Completely Hollywood*, Best Ensemble — *Godspell*, Best Male Vocalist — Tyler Smalling, Special Recognition: Musicians on Stage — Matthew DiGeloromo.

Mr. Cacciola said that the Board received a cc of a letter to parents of students attending St. John's HS explaining that the public schools will begin on September 9, 2013 and the non-public schools will begin on September 4, 2013, leaving the matter of transporting students for the first week in the hands of their parents. The public school districts are not required to provide transportation. After some discussion:

### **Superintendent's Report/Educational Presentation:**

### Selection Classification Discussion — Anthony Spinelli

Mr. Cacciola started a discussion about whether the Board wants to bring the selection classification policy up for a change to include JV selection classification. Concerns included who makes the determination, ensuring that the student is truly eligible for moving up, and emotional ability of the student athlete. Mr. Spinelli said that he would be comfortable with students in eighth grade moving up. Trustee Campasano said that she would like a more thorough review. After further discussion:

Trustee Bocca seconded by Trustee Scarlatos made a motion to move forward on a policy revision to the selection classification policy.

The motion was **CARRIED** by all present.

### Affordable Care Act Report: Yiendhy Farrelly, Ed. D. and Jennifer Buscemi

Dr. Farrelly and Mrs. Buscemi offered a presentation to explain the impact of the Affordable Care Act on the district. Measures such as adjusting employee hours and costly penalties that the district could face if mistakes are made, were discussed. The process for ensuring compliance is lengthy and ongoing from month to month and year to year. Mr. Cacciola commended Dr. Farrelly and Mrs. Buscemi for their extensive work on this presentation and review of the Affordable Care Act. He noted that the district is seeking direction from law firms. Answers are not yet known.
