PRESENTATION: Tobacco Free Schools Project - Karyn Kirschbaum, Tobacco Specialist WS BOCES

Mr. Cacciola said that West Babylon School District has participated in the Tobacco Free Schools Project for a number of years. He introduced Ms. Kirschbaum of WS BOCES to offer her presentation. Ms. Kirschbaum thanked the Board and Administration for inviting her this evening. She said that the Tobacco Action Coalition recently held a recognition luncheon to which 12 superintendents were invited, including West Babylon's Superintendent. She said that she appreciates the support of the district's liaisons Jaime Dascoli, Dana Ackerman and Joseph Serigano. She presented the Board members, and administrators with information about staff survey reports and pens. In addition, the district received a framed certificate. Ms. Kirschbaum said that the schools are the place to start encouraging students to remain tobacco free. She also thanked Mr. Cacciola, Dr. Palma, and the Board of Education, adding that communication is the key to successful enforcement. A Photo was taken.

In response to WB Taxpayers association President William Hill's question, Mr. Flower said that the budget transfers on this evening's agenda have not been completed.

Resident Carol Stoehrer explained her concern about the Health and Wellness Policy that is on the agenda for adoption this evening. She offered a presentation of the differences between home baked goods vs. manufactured and prepackaged food. She suggested alternatives to not providing baked goods i.e.; permission slips or an acceptable alternative treat for a specific child. She added that she contacted the Suffolk County Health Inspector and was told that the county does not preside over the classroom. She also noted that this will affect family picnics, etc. President Farrell suggested that anyone interested in attending the meeting send an e-mail to Mr. Cacciola. Resident Leslie Cosie read a letter from her pediatrician offering his opinion that he does not believe home baked goods and occasional treats have a negative impact on weight; believing instead that the daily food choices are more important. President Farrell thanked everyone for their input.

Resident Catherine Campbell discussed the use of clear backpacks at the high school. She received a letter stating that any backpack can be used this year and then was told that students must use clear backpacks, after purchasing a regular backpack. She wanted clarity about which backpack is in compliance.

Resident Lisa Davino read from the section II handbook which recognizes cheerleading as a support activity. She said instead of criticism from those not competing, West Babylon should be proud of the cheerleaders' talents.
