OLD/NEW BUSINESS:

Committee Reports:

Trustee Thiel read the minutes of the December 10, 2009 and January 5, 2010 Strategic Plan committee meetings which are on file in the District Clerk's office.

Mr. Cacciola said that he is proud of the work done on the Strategic Plan to date and thanked all who have served on the task force. He offered special thanks to Mark Flower and West Babylon Taxpayers Association President William Hill for the time and effort that they have put into the Strategic Plan. He added that he looks forward to continued success in working together.

A policy committee meeting was scheduled for January 26, 2010 at 5:30 pm.

A curriculum meeting was scheduled for February 9, 2010 at 5:30 pm

Mr. Morrell explained that he has been working with the attorneys for the energy performance contract. He said that they have 5 or 6 questions which Mr. Flower is addressing. An operations committee meeting will be scheduled once the information is completed.

Trustee DeGaetano said that she is a member of the technology committee and asked for suggestions for the new website, which included; a parent portal with homework assignments and student grades; athletic schedules; and others. Mrs. DeGaetano said she would bring the recommendations to the committee.

Mr. Cacciola officially welcomed Mrs. Farrelly in her new role as the Executive Director for Human Resources.

Budget Review: 1st Draft - Mark Flower, Assistant Superintendent for Finance

Mr. Flower said that the district wants to be completely transparent throughout the budget process. He provided a budget calendar and said that on January 19 at 8:30, after the Strategic Plan presentation, there will be a budget meeting in the Board room. He said that the first of the budget shows a 3.44% increase to the budget. He reviewed some of the budget lines. He said that at the budget meeting the Board will go through every note line by line. At Mr. Cacciola's request, Mr. Flower explained the budget transfers that are on this evening's agenda are a result of the Governor's withholding of 10% of December's state aid payment and 19% of the district's star payment. He noted that the district received \$1.5 million dollars less than expected by this time. If money becomes available in April as the district was told it will, the money could be restored to these budget lines.

STATEMENT OF RESIDENTS:

In response to resident Diane Menke's question, Mr. Flower said that if the funds are not restored by the Governor, many budget lines would have to be adjusted to cover the loss in state aid and it will have an impact on next year.

In response to resident Carol Stoehrer's question, Trustee DeGaetano said that she believes a PTA web page is being created for the new website. She said she will verify this with the committee.

Mrs. Stoehrer said that she also spoke with Legislator Gregory and suggested that letters of thanks be written to him for his efforts in trying to keep the home for sex offenders out of our area. She also thanked the district for being proactive in this work.

Resident Maureen Henshaw discussed the leave return of a teacher, mid-year. She said contractual or not, she does not believe this is good for the students.

Resident and South Bay PTA President Diana Doerbecker offered her thanks for the donations of coats through her PTA.

Trustee Nocera seconded by Trustee DeGaetano made a motion to adjourn at 9:33 pm.
