A REGULAR MEETING of the Board of Education of the West Babylon Union Free School District, of the Town of Babylon, Suffolk County, New York was held on TUESDAY, January 26, 2010, in the Board Room of the Administration Wing adjacent to the Senior High School.

President Farrell opened the meeting at 7:15 pm and led those present in the Pledge to the Flag.

Mr. Cacciola thanked all for attending this evening. He turned the meeting over to Mrs. Levy who introduced Mr. Theo and Ms. DeCarlo for the student presentation. Mr. Theo explained that the children worked on the tribute to Martin Luther King, Jr. in honor of his birthday this month. The students provided some examples of work done in their classes and read speeches about Mr. King, Jr. A DVD was played demonstrating the cooperative assignments the students worked on in their classrooms. Mr. Theo and Ms. DeCarlo explained that Character Education was emphasized throughout these assignments. Throughout the assignments students increased their awareness of the importance of empathy towards others. A photo was taken.

Trustee Thiel seconded by trustee Romano made a motion to go into executive session at 7:28 pm to discuss legal and personnel matters.

Statement of the Superintendent and/or Board of Education:

Mr. Cacciola noted that the High School will perform the musical "Footloose" on February 4th at 1:00 pm; and on February 5th and 6th at 8:00 pm. All performances will be in the High School PAC. He said that the February 4th performance will be held for senior citizens, free of charge. Mr. Cacciola added that the dress rehearsals have been excellent.

Mr. Cacciola readdressed the discussion from the January 12th Board meeting regarding a homeless shelter for sex offenders being placed in the town of Babylon. He said that there will be no homeless shelter for sex offenders in the town. However, the alternative is worse because sex offenders would be provided with vouchers which will enable them to seek housing wherever they would like to live. He said that a letter prepared by Dr. Palma and PTA Council is available for anyone interested in sending it to our elected officials.

Mr. Cacciola said that last evening he attended the Nassau Suffolk School Boards annual dinner meeting with Mrs. Campasano, Mrs. DeGaetano, Mrs. Thiel and Mr. Flower. The topic covered at the meeting was school district budgets. He said a letter writing campaign sponsored by the Suffolk County Association of School Superintendents is planned. Mr. Cacciola said he will appeal to local organizations i.e., PTA, Taxpayers Assoc., etc., to assist in writing letters (SCSSA is hoping that upwards of 15,000 letters will sent) to our legislators.

Mr. Cacciola noted that the report of the Comptroller is on the district's website. He said that Channel 12 news and Newsday each briefly reported about the district's report. Mr. Flower explained that the audit covered the period of July 1, 2007 through December 31, 2008 and the state's audit team was in the district for almost a year. He said the report had five findings and ten recommendations. The findings and recommendations as well

as the district's response to them is available on the district. The district has implemented changes in accordance with the audit findings and recommendations.

Trustee Thiel read the minutes of the December 8, 2009 and the January 12, 2010 Curriculum Committee meetings (on file in the District Clerk's office). The next meeting of the Curriculum Committee will be held on February 9th.

Budget Draft #1 Review: Mark Flower, Assistant Superintendent for Finance

Mr. Flower presented the first draft of the proposed budget for 2010-2011. Through a PowerPoint presentation he discussed the possible best and worst case scenarios. If the current proposal of the Governor is adopted, the district faces a 9.86% increase to the tax rate. If state aid remains flat,

the district faces a 6.28% increase to the tax rate. Mr. Cacciola said that he does not believe the community will be able to support these increases. Mr. Hill suggested that the Board become more transparent by providing residents with a history of past years' budgets to compare. Mr. Flower said he will prepare a revenue report for the next Board meeting. Mr. Flower said that the second budget draft will include more possible scenarios. It was suggested that a list of which items can and cannot be cut from the budget also be provided.

Resident Ray Cody welcomed Mrs. Farrelly to her new position. In addition, he suggested lowering the thermostat in the Board room.
